They distinguish between assessment of instruction, assessment for instruction, and assessment as instruction (Chappius, Stiggins, Chappius, & Arter, 2012; Earl, 2003). Assessment of instruction is summative and is especially useful in determining the degree to which a student has mastered an extended body of content or set of KUDs at a concluding point in a sequence of learning.
